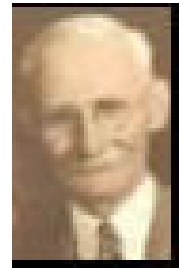


Oscar Hilding Hagg (Service number – 31089520)

15th August 1910 - 21st May 1996

Oscar Hilding Hagg was born on August 15th 1910, in Massachusetts to Oscar George Alexandra (b.1885) and Elina Christina Peterson (b.1873) Hagg. Oscar was one of seven children – one of which was and a half brother called Chester William Olsson (b.1900). Oscar had two brothers, Arthur Alexander (b.1906), and Albert Olaf (b.1914) and three sisters, Elise Cecelia Marie (b.1908), Effie Signe (b.1909) and Mabel (b.1913).

Oscar's parents Oscar and Elina were originally from Sweden. Oscar Sr. emigrated to the U.S in 1904 and Elina in 1894. Elina married Oliver Simon Olsson (b.1875) in 1896 and had several children, Walter Henry (1897-1898), Chester William (1900-1924) and Hazel Victoria (1902-1904). Unfortunately, her husband, Oliver, passed away in 1904.

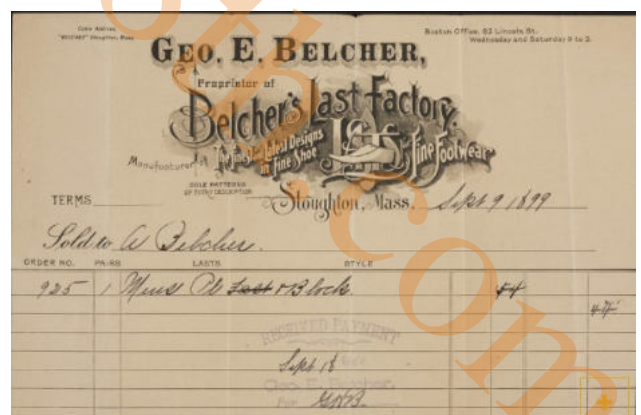

Oscar and Elina married in 1905. In 1910 just before Oscar was born the family lived at 13a Off Washington Street, Stoughton, Norfolk, Massachusetts. Oscar Sr. was working as a counter maker in a factory.

In 1920 the family owned 47 Thomas St, Stoughton, Norfolk, Massachusetts. Oscar Sr. was a labour for Rubber coal manufacturing. Unfortunately, in 1924 Oscar's half brother, Chester, passed away.

In 1929 Oscar's brother, Arthur, married Helen L and they adopted a boy Arthur Sommers (b.1927) and after many years had a child of their own, Kenneth Alexander (b.1945)

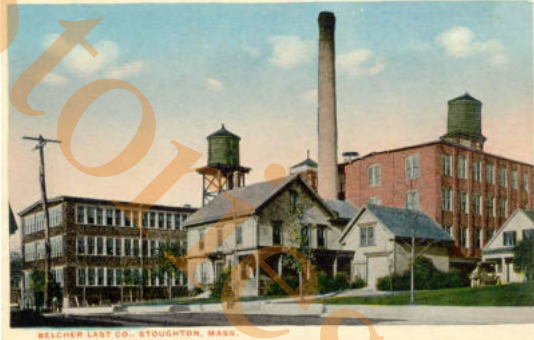
In 1930 the family was living in 759 Central Street, Stoughton, Norfolk, Massachusetts. The family had three young children (Fred, Edward and Elmer) from the Parson family boarding with them. Oscar Sr. was now working as a machinist in a machine shop and Oscar Jr. was a Turner for the Geo E Belcher Last Co Factory. Oscar's sisters, Elise and Mabel, were working as a weaver at Elector Well Mill and his brother Albert was working as a mechanic in a garage.



Although still living with the family, Effie was not working as she was about to marry Thomas Benjamin Mann (b.1908). They went on to have six sons, Albert P (b.1933), Thomas A (b.1935), Chester P (b.1937), Wayne C (b.1944), Glenn A (b.1946) and Joel C (b.1949) and two daughters, Elaine C (b.1931) and Mable S. (b.1942).

In 1931, Oscar graduated from Wentworth School where he attended evening classes in plumbing. His sister Elise also got married to Garfield Farmer in 1931. They had two sons, Garfield (b.1935) and Albert G (b.1939).

In 1940, Oscar was now 29 years old. He and his sister Mabel were living with their parents in the family home in Central Street. Two of the Parson's children were still boarding with them as well as two other young children. Oscar was now working as a band saw operator at Geo E Belcher Last factory and Mabel was still a weaver. Oscar Sr. was now a proprietor of a farm.



Oscar's brother, Albert was married (1936) to Bernice Elizabeth Sidebottom (b.1911) and had a daughter Bernice (b.1940) – shortly followed by a son, Peter (b.1943). They were living at 27 Oakland Street and Edward Parsons (mentioned in 1930) was lodging with them. Both Albert and Edward were working at Geo E. Belcher Last Co Factory.

Oscar and Albert were drafted on October 16th, 1940. At the time Oscar was still working for Geo E Belcher Last Co who was a manufacturer of fine shoes, based at Stoughton, Massachusetts. Albert was working for Woodard and Wright. Oscar enlisted on April 8th, 1942 in Boston, Massachusetts. He was single with no dependents and his occupation was noted as *“Skilled occupations in manufacture of miscellaneous finished lumber products, n.e.c”*

SUMTER, S. C., Dec. 10.—Miss Alpha Allie Barkley of Sumter and Oscar Hilding Hagg of Stoughton, Mass., were married December 3, by Rev. W. G. Moore, of the First Baptist church.

On December 3rd, 1943 Oscar married Alpha Allie Barkley (b.1917)

In 1950 Oscar, with his wife Alpha and two children, George Rawleigh (b.1949) and Calvin Lawrence (b.1947), were living at 80 Vanway St Land, Stoughton, Norfolk, Massachusetts. Oscar was back working at Geo E Belcher Last Co along with his brother Albert.

In January 1958, tragedy hit Oscar as his eldest son, Calvin, lost his fight to cancer. He was only 10 years old.

News has been received here of the death of Calvin L. Hagg, 10, son of Mr. and Mrs. Oscar H. Hagg of Stoughton, Mass.

Mrs. Hagg is the former Miss Alpha Barkley of Sumter.

Calvin succumbed to cancer at his home. Last March, a tumor was found on his leg, which was amputated at Baker Memorial Hospital, Boston. He was then transferred to the Children's Hospital, where he was a patient in the Jimmy Fund Building.

He was a fifth grade pupil and attended the Methodist Church Sunday School. He was a cub scout, and pallbearers were all den chiefs of his troop.

He is also survived by a brother, George R. Hagg, 8, of Stoughton, and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Jessie Barkley Wells of Sumter.

On June 9th, 1977 Oscar's son George married Melody Cynthia Fahey in Stoughton. They had two daughters, Juliette A and Laurette P.

In August 1977, Alpha passed away in Sumter, South Carolina. Oscar passed away on May 21st, 1996.
